RE: Master's Thesis Agreement

In accordance with *Purdue University Executive Memorandum B-10*, the copyright ownership of your master's thesis resides with you, the author. In signing the *Purdue University Graduate School Master's Thesis Agreement (G.S. Form 19)*, you give permission to Purdue University to reproduce, distribute, and display, in whole or in part, your master's thesis. Please read the agreement carefully, as it is a binding agreement between you and Purdue University. You have the option to sign the agreement.

The *Master's Thesis Agreement (G.S. Form 19)* is a critical component of your thesis. This form, whether you signed it or not, is to be placed immediately after the *Thesis Acceptance (G.S. Form 9)* and immediately before the blank page. The placement of the original *Master's Thesis Agreement (G.S. Form 19)* results in it being the second page of the bound thesis. In addition, a copy of *G.S. Form 19* should be included in the departmental copy of the thesis.

PLEASE READ PRIOR TO DOWNLOADING!

G. S. Form 19, “Master’s Thesis Agreement”

- At least one copy of this form *must* be printed on 100% cotton, non-acidic paper *prior* to completing it (your signature is *optional* but is strongly recommended). The Graduate School requires an “archival quality” copy of your Master’s Thesis Agreement form to ensure it remains in good condition, since wood-pulp (“acidic”) paper deteriorates (“browns and crumbles”) with age.
- Once you have completed your 100% cotton copy of this form please ensure, as stated in current procedures, it is bound into the 100% cotton “deposit copy” of your thesis you are required to submit at your final deposit appointment. This copy will, in turn, be permanently shelved at the Purdue Libraries Repository.
- All other copies of your Master’s Thesis Agreement form may be printed on regular copier paper, unless departmental requirements dictate otherwise.
- Candidates unable to immediately obtain 100% cotton paper from their department or workplace may contact the Thesis/Dissertation Office and it will be furnished to them at no charge.

I grant in perpetuity, without restriction, royalty free to Purdue University the nonexclusive right and license to reproduce, distribute, and display, in whole or in part, my master's thesis in any format now known or later developed.

I hereby acknowledge that the master's thesis submitted with this *agreement* is my original work, and I have the authority to grant the nonexclusive right and license specified above. I also acknowledge that I have obtained the necessary and appropriate permissions, including permission for uses in this *agreement*, to materials for which I do not own the copyright that are included in my master's thesis.

This *agreement* shall survive assignment of any and all exclusive rights provided to copyright holders in Section 106 of the United States copyright law.

I authorize Purdue University to maintain my thesis in any and all formats now known or later developed.
